- Candidate replies are printed without editing or verification.
- References to opponents or specific persons are not allowed.
- In place of an inappropriate response, the guide will state, "Candidate's response did not meet the criteria listed in this Voter Guide."
- Candidates are listed in order of the district the office will represent.
- This Voter Guide is organized by office.
- The names of unopposed candidates are also listed.
- Questionnaires were sent to all candidates running for US Senate and House of Representatives and State House of Representatives.

- All questionnaires were identical, regardless of candidate's office.
- Questionnaires were not sent to Presidential campaigns, Judicial candidates, candidates for Local
 offices (County, City, Township, or Village), or candidates for School Districts.

CANDIDATE QUESTIONS

The questionnaire sent to all candidates for Federal and State offices included (consisted of) the following questions. Candidates were also given the opportunity to submit comments.

QUESTION 1

Since 1978, Michigan statute allows parents to exempt their children from mandatory vaccinations based on medical, religious, or other reasons. Thousands of parents have expressed how grateful they are to live in a state where parents have the freedom to make vaccine decisions for their children. They know how precious health care rights are and want to know whether candidates support the preservation of this legal right.

• Do you support an individual's/parent's right to make vaccine decisions for themselves and their children in accordance with existing Michigan statute?

QUESTION 2

Michigan statute provides a clear, simple process for citizens to exercise their choice to remain exempt from vaccine mandates (i.e., parent provides written statement to the school with no involvement of the health department). However, in 2015, the State Department of Health & Human Services exceeded the statute by issuing an administrative rule to require parents to meet personally with employees of county health departments before being 'granted' a vaccine waiver for their child to attend school or daycare – often requiring multiple meetings depending on the number of children and grade level. MVC members find these mandated meetings to be a substantial burden, and many department employees to be demeaning of their vaccine decisions. Parents are forced to provide private health information about their child without their consent, which also violates their privacy rights under federal privacy laws (HIPAA/FERPA). Parents support legislation that both protects the privacy of children's student health records and prohibits unelected government agencies from enforcing administrative rules that exceed the requirements of existing statutes.

 Do you support requiring legislative approval before unelected state or local agencies can add additional burdens on parents or individuals seeking to exercise their right to make vaccine decisions?

QUESTION 3

In recent years, employees in some industries have been faced with vaccination requirements as a condition of employment, such as annual flu shots for healthcare workers. Since the creation of the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program (VICP) (through the passage of the 1986 National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act), over \$4.7 billion in compensation has been paid by the federal government for injuries and deaths caused by vaccinations – with a good proportion injury from the flu shot. Given there are demonstrated risks from vaccinations, employees are understandably concerned when they are mandated to receive vaccinations or risk termination of employment (or other punitive actions).

• Do you support an employee's right to make their own medical decisions and, therefore, believe their acceptance of vaccinations should not be a condition of employment?

QUESTION 4

Citizens and scientists alike are justifiably concerned that the COVID-19 genetic vaccines were fast-tracked and resulted in products that were not adequately tested for safety. As with any medication, any new vaccine also carries risks of harm to some individuals. The number of adverse events reported to the CDC/FDA Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System has exceeded 1.6 million events, with over 28,000 cases of myocarditis and over 37,000 deaths. There have been more adverse events reported for the COVID-19 genetic vaccines than those reported for ALL other vaccines for the past THIRTY-TWO years. Citizens are concerned that new vaccines, such as those for COVID-19 or RSV, will be mandated at the state or federal level in the near future, trampling an individual's rights to bodily autonomy and religious freedom.

US SENATOR (1 SEAT)

Six-year term. One of two members of the U.S. Senate from Michigan. The Senate has the exclusive power to advise and consent on presidential nominations to executive and judicial offices, to ratify U.S. treaties, and to try impeachments. With the U.S. House, the Senate adopts budgets, levies taxes, borrows money, regulates interstate commerce, provides services, adopts regulations, and declares war. Current annual salary: \$174,000.

US REPRESENTATIVES TO CONGRESS (13 SEATS)

Also referred to as a congressman or congresswoman, each representative is elected to a two-year term serving the people of a specific congressional district. Among other duties, representatives introduce bills and resolutions, offer amendments and serve on committees. The number of representatives with full voting rights is 435. The number of representatives per state is proportionate to population. Current annual salary: \$174,000.

STATE REPRESENTATIVES (110 SEATS)

The Michigan House of Representatives consists of 110 members who are elected in even-numbered years to 2-year terms. The state legislature enacts the laws of Michigan; levies taxes and appropriates funds from money collected for the support of public institutions and the administration of the affairs of state government; proposes amendments to the state constitution, which must be approved by a majority vote of the electors; and considers legislation proposed by initiatory petitions. The legislature also provides oversight of the executive branch of government through the administrative rules and audit processes, committees, and the budget process; advises and consents, through the Senate, on gubernatorial appointments; and considers proposed amendments to the Constitution of the United States. The majority of the legislature's work, however, entails lawmaking. Through a process defined by the state constitution, statute, and legislative rules, the legislature considers thousands of bills (proposed laws) during each 2-year session. Current annual salary: \$71,685.
